## Read Genesis 41

**Note**: In the previous 13 years, Joseph had experienced incredible hardships and injustices. He was abused by his brothers. His brothers did not speak a single kind word to him. He was the object of a murder plot, thrown into a cistern and sold by his brothers into slavery. He was taken from his homeland and sold in Egypt to a new master. His master's wife tried to seduce him repeatedly and then unjustly accused him of assaulting her. He was then thrown into prison and later forgotten by the one who could have been instrumental in gaining his freedom.

## <u>Day 4</u> Memory Verse reviewed today? Yes\_\_\_No\_\_\_

Genesis 42-44 explain how Joseph's brothers went to Egypt to get grain during the famine and had to appear before Joseph, the second in command. Although they did not recognize their brother, Joseph recognized them, but kept it to himself. Later, through a series of events, the youngest brother finds himself falsely accused of stealing. Still not recognizing Joseph's true identification, the brothers throw themselves down at the mercy of their powerful brother, Joseph.

In future lessons we will deal with appropriate responses for your specific situations. However, answer the following questions for the purpose of understanding how Joseph honored God in his particular circumstances.

## Read Genesis 45

- **22.** From vs. 5, what did Joseph communicate to the family members who had sold him into slavery (which ultimately brought him to be forgotten in prison)?
- **23.** From vs. 5-8, how many times does Joseph mention that it was God who had sent Joseph there?
- **24.** What did Joseph understand about God that gave him such a godly response to his brothers?
- 25. What do vs. 10 & 11 reveal about Joseph's attitude towards those who had treated him so horribly?

26.	From verse 15, what was Joseph's physical response towards his brothers who had treated him so horribly?
27.	How do Joseph's actions compare to those of one who does NOT seek to honor God by her responses?

29.	Consider your responses in both attitude and action to those who have hurt you in any way. Which of these are honoring to God?
30.	Which are not honoring to God?
