Application Questions

*These questions are designed to help you understand how God's Word applies to your life personally.*

6. Do you think the Lord is prompting you to engage in some type of fast? What do you think that fast would specifically involve? (Remember it is not wrong for people to know you are fasting, it is wrong to do it "to be noticed" (Matthew 6)
7. How has God used a "no" to a prayer request for good in your life?
