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These questions are designed to help you understand how God's Word applies to your life personally.

1. As we head into fall and Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas celebrations in front of us, let's be mindful of making the most of opportunities with the literal neighbors that God has placed around us who are not yet in relationship with him. Here is a fresh idea for you to consider doing individually or as a couple.

Take a Prayer Walk

- a. This week take a walk in your neighborhood, workplace, school, or local town/city center.
 - b. As you walk, ask God to help you see this place and its people with new eyes (as God sees them). Is there any disobedience you need to confess and repent of before seeing others as God sees them? See what you notice.
 - c. Also, ask God to help you imagine what it will look like for God's kingdom to come in your sphere of influence and possibly in your own heart. Pray that this would be so. Write down what that looks like and share with this with another.
2. Read Nehemiah 11:1-2
 3. What do you perceive as some of the Kingdom opportunities around you because of where you live?
 4. What do you perceive as some of the Kingdom opportunities around you because of where you work?
 5. What are some of your challenges in seizing those opportunities?
 6. Read I Corinthians 12:14-20
 7. Who is somebody who has used their God given gift to help you in your spiritual journey? How have they helped you?
 8. What spiritual gifts do you believe God has given you? How did you discover your gifting? How are you using your gift(s)?
 9. Have you ever struggled with being content with the gifts and level of impact God has chosen for you? How have you tried to deal with that discontentment?
