LOOK BACK

- **BLESS:** How has the Spirit of God prompted you to reach out to others in the last week or two? What actions or steps did you take?
- **Praise: Read Psalm 34:1-8:** Give praise to God for WHO He is and WHAT He has done and an affirmation of where our hope is. (How have you seen him work, answer a prayer, bless you or someone else?)
- The language of our faith is thanksgiving in all things. What difficult circumstance in your life will you, by faith, give thanks for?
- **Confession:** Pride is the great enemy of grace and faith. How has your pride robbed God of the glory He deserves?

LOOK IN

- Read Galatians 6:11-18
- What does it look like when you leave life for “show”?
- How has avoiding persecution caused you to shrink back from walking with Jesus?
- How does someone actually “boast in the cross”?
- What is it about your life that can only be explained by the fact that you are a “new creation”?
- What questions, concerns, or doubts do you have regarding what you have heard and read?
- How did the Holy Spirit speak through this passage to inform, remind, convict, or encourage you?
