C LOOK BACK

- Have you been baptized since your salvation in Jesus? How does your understanding of baptism reflect its true purpose of identifying with Christ?
- Do you ever find yourself more influenced by a speaker's eloquence and personality, or by the truth of the gospel? How can you ensure your faith is rooted in Christ rather than in human wisdom?
- How can you share the gospel while keeping the focus on the power of the cross instead of relying on persuasive arguments or personal charisma?
- What questions, concerns, or doubts do you have regarding what you have heard and read?
- How did the Holy Spirit speak through this passage to inform, remind, convict, or encourage you?
